

Workshop Summary

This one-day workshop has been developed to address the training need which has arisen following the government's decision to bring into effect Part P of the Building Regulations on 1st January 2005. From 1st January 2005, anybody carrying out electrical installation work in dwellings in England & Wales will be required to make "reasonable provision in the design, installation, inspection and testing" of this work to protect persons against fire or injury.

Who Should Attend

Anybody carrying out electrical installation work in dwellings in England & Wales who already has appropriate knowledge and experience of the testing, certification and reporting procedures for the work undertaken. In addition, they must be conversant with the following:

- The *Electricity at Work Regulations*
- The current issue of BS7671 (IEE Wiring Regulations - currently in the 17th Edition)
- The applicable Building Regulations (not just Part P, but any other part of the regulations that may apply to a particular job)

Benefits to you and Your Organisation

At the end of the workshop, and subject to passing an on-line multiple-choice examination, you will be able to self-certify that their electrical installation work complies with Building Regulations.
