

Workshop Summary

This qualification was developed in partnership with the Electrical Contactors Association (ECA), National Inspection Council for Electrical Installation Contracting (NICEIC), Corgi and SummitSkills. The qualification has been developed to comply with the requirements of Part P of the Building Regulations introduced by the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM). This requirement means that from 1 January 2005 electrical installation work in dwellings will need to comply with Building Regulations (Part P) and work will need to be carried out by persons who are competent to do so.

Who Should Attend

This VRQ has been developed for candidates who need to comply with the Part P requirements **and** prove they are competent to carry out the electrical work in dwellings. This qualification will allow candidates to be nominated as a 'qualified supervisor' with a Competent Persons Scheme. Registration with such a scheme will enable self-certification of domestic electrical installation work to the Building Regulations. The successful candidate will be considered to have achieved competence, specifically as a Domestic Electrical Installer. They will not be considered to have achieved the recognised competence required to operate as an electrician.

Benefits to you and Your Organisation

The fundamental objective of this qualification is to enable candidates to develop the competences to allow them to legally carry out electrical installation work in dwellings. It references those skills necessary to carry out domestic electrical installation work in accordance with standard circuit arrangements.
